### TRINITY SCHOOL DRAMA PRODUCTIONS

This semester, the seniors will present Henrick Ibsen's *A Doll's House* as their first drama production. The play is a powerful presentation of the ambiguous and complex relationships in a troubled marriage. The public performance—for parents, family members, friends, etc.—will take place on the evening of Friday, March 12. It starts at 7:30. Admission is \$5 for an adult and \$3 for a child, with a maximum charge of \$15 for a family. Children who attend the evening performance must be accompanied by an adult.

We want to give everyone a chance to see all the wonderful drama productions presented by our junior and senior class members. So, each play is presented twice. The first presentation is set aside specifically for the current Greenlawn students and faculty. This presentation happens during the school day, in place of regular classes. As a result, others are not admitted to the auditorium without the specific approval of the head of school or his associate. The evening performance is open to everyone. ## COMMENDATIONS

### MOCK TRIAL

Trinity School fielded four Mock Trial teams this year and three of them qualified for the State Competition in Indianapolis on March 6 and 7! The senior team, styled The Scourge of Grits in Tangerine Chains, (the team members choose their own names) placed second in the South Bend regional. The junior team went undefeated in the Elkhart regional and placed second. They are an all-girl team appropriately named, Death by Stilettos. The mostly sophomore team, Imperially Nonchalant, placed fourth in Elkhart and qualified for state. Another sophomore team, the Mildly Attractive Indo-Europeans competed aggressively in the most competitive regional, but did not make it to state.

Of the 28 Greenlawn students who competed, 12 won individual awards. Winning Best Witness awards were seniors Laura Kane and Josh Thomas, juniors Brady Adams and Annie Zwerneman, and sophomore Matthew Staffelbach. The Best Attorneys were seniors Theresa Behrens and Kelci Schmidt, juniors Katherine Mayer and Emma Venter, and sophomores Addison Kane, Katie Loughran and Madeline Pingel. Congratulations to all!
